

Tips to Prevent Scams and Fraud

Education, awareness and prevention are key factors in helping to protect seniors against scams and fraud. Seniors make up 13.3% of the U.S. population and are the most targeted age group. 50% of phone scams are aimed at seniors and 30% of consumer fraud. With the holidays quickly approaching, fraud and scams can be on the rise. To protect yourself, or a loved one, remember the tips below.

- Never give out personal information to telemarketers, or any stranger. Do not disclose credit card numbers, bank account numbers, date of birth, Social Security numbers, or addresses to unknown companies, or unknown persons.
- Phone scammers will often try to capture their senior audience by being warm, friendly and personable. Do not try to "help" them by sending them money to receive a contest prize, trip, or vacation that they claim you "won."
- If you doubt the legitimacy of your caller, ask them for their company name, address and phone number where they can be reached at a later time. If it is a scammer,

- If you are female and live alone, never disclose that you live • Funeral and cemetery scams alone. On your voicemail, use a personal greeting. If you say "We are not available," instead of, "I am not available." This leads people to believe there with them. is more than one person in the household.
- anyone you do not know. Scammers can pretend to be utility or electric workers, or pretend to be raising money for a healthcare provider immediately. charity or another organization. They often mislead seniors by appearing warm and friendly, or by trying to offer one of their services that could "help" a senior. Never allow a stranger into your home.
- To avoid mail theft, avoid having checks or other highly sensitive items mailed directly to vour home. Instead, use a P.O. box, or have them deposited directly into your bank account.
- Many seniors are targeted in investment schemes. Never disclose any personal information
